THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1948.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Mallia, in the District of Limassol, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF MALLIA
UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1948, the Village Health Commission of Mallia hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Mallia) (Amendment) Rules, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Mallia) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Mallia) Rules, 1938 and 1949.

2. The following rules shall be substituted for rules 20 and 32, respectively, of the principal Rules :—

"*Rule 20.*—The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say :—

(a) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox	1	4½
(b) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep	1	0
(c) For every swine	1	0

Rule 32.—There shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods a fee of one para per oke." (M.P. 538/49.)
