No. 360. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE
REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purpose of Defence

Regulation 61 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, I hereby order as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Supplies and Services (Zivania Control) (Amendment) Order, 1949, and shall be read together with the Supplies and Services (Zivania Control) Order, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”) and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Supplies and Services (Zivania Control) Orders, 1949.

2. Regulation 2 of the principal Order is hereby amended by the insertion therein at its appropriate alphabetical order of the following definition :—

“ ‘Zivania’ includes any ethyl alcohol of any strength.”

THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1948.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Anoyira, in the District of Limassol, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

**RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF ANOYIRA
UNDER SECTION 9.**

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1948 the Village Health Commission of Anoyira hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Anoyira) (Amendment) Rules, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Anoyira) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Rules”), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Anoyira) Rules, 1938 and 1949.

2. The following rules shall be substituted for rules 20 and 46, respectively, of the principal Rules :—

“Rule 20.—The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house, that is to say :—

(a) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep	-	4
(b) For every swine	1	0
(c) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox	1	0

Rule 46.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :—

(a) For every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof ..	-	6
(b) For every carcass of a young lamb or kid or part thereof	-	4
(c) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow, bullock or swine or part thereof	2	0

(2) The fees in paragraph (1) of this rule prescribed shall not be payable by any person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, who is a monthly or yearly lessee of any shop, stall or place in the meat market under rule 45 of these rules.”

3. The following Chapter shall be added to the principal rules :—

“Chapter 1.—*Market of Perishable Goods.*

26. The Village Health Commission may from time to time by public notification appoint any premises or place within the area of the village to be the market of perishable goods.

27. No person shall sell or expose for sale any perishable goods at any place within the area of the village, except at the market of perishable goods appointed by the Village Health Commission.

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
