LIMASSOL ..	The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 135° to the high seas from the Roman Catholic Cemetery, situated 16½ cables north-eastwards of Limassol fixed Red Light, and a line drawn 135° to the high seas from the centre of Zakaki village, on Admiralty Chart No. 846 of the 3rd February, 1939.
PAPHOS ..	The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 270° to the high seas from Paphos lighthouse and a line drawn 270° to the high seas from a point of intersection of the north bank of the river Ezousa Potamos with the Mediterranean Sea, on Admiralty Chart No. 846 of the 3rd February, 1939.
LATCHI ..	The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 000° to the high seas from Argaka village and a line drawn 000° to the high seas from a point of intersection of the foreshore through Kakoskaliou island, on Admiralty Chart No. 2074 of the 24th May, 1892.
KARAVOSTASI ..	The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 000° to the high seas from the point of intersection of the eastern bank of the river Kambos with the Mediterranean Sea and a line drawn 000° to the high seas from the point of intersection of the western bank of the river Lefkatis with the Mediterranean Sea, on Admiralty Chart No. 847 of the 31st December, 1936.
KYRENIA..	The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 000° to the high seas from the Old Church east of the town and a line drawn 000° to the high seas from the Hill marked 105 feet west of the town, on Admiralty Chart No. 847 of the 31st December, 1936.
BOGHAZ ..	The territorial waters of Cyprus contained within a line drawn 139° to the high seas from Castrouli Hill (83 feet) and a line drawn 139° to the high seas from conspicuous white house, on Admiralty Chart No. 847 of the 31st December, 1936.

No. 409. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 3) 1948.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2386

MADE UNDER SECTION 52.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1948, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Certain Articles) (Cyprus Airways Limited) Exemption Order, 1949.

2. The articles specified in the Schedule hereto, when imported by Cyprus Airways, Ltd., shall, subject to the terms and conditions set out in the said Schedule, be admitted into the Colony free from import duty.

SCHEDULE.

Apparatus, appliances, furniture, and fittings and component parts thereof, and instruments (including navigator's watches) carried on or in aircraft and necessarily and exclusively used in or for its operation; apparatus, appliances and component parts thereof, and instruments and tools used for the purpose of visual communication or electrical contact with or guiding or navigation of aircraft in flight, or for the examination, servicing and maintenance of aircraft and aircraft components for ensuring airworthiness, or for the securing of aircraft whilst grounded.

Provided that:—

- (a) A declaration shall be given, signed on behalf of the Company by either its Managing Director or Secretary that the goods are for use in the operation of the Company's air line from, to, or through the Colony or the Company's purposes incidental thereto and will not be sold or otherwise disposed of or used in the Colony except after payment of any duty otherwise due thereon;
- (b) Materials imported for the purpose of repairing aircraft, or for making up any such article to be used in such repair shall not be included in the exemption.

THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
ACT, 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE GOVERNOR.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) Act, 1945, as extended to the Colony by the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Colonies, etc.) Order in Council, 1946, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Defence (Building Operations) Control Regulations, 1943 and 1947 (Revocation) Order, 1949.

2. The Defence (Building Operations) Control Regulations, 1943 and 1947 are hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
