No. 418. THE TOBACCO LAWS, 1932 TO 1949.**NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 8 AND 10 (1).**

Notice is hereby given that in exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 8 and 10 (1) of the Tobacco Laws, 1932 to 1949, the dates to be observed under the respective sections are prescribed as follows:—

- (a) any leaf tobacco, other than fumigated tobacco, in the possession of any grower shall, when dry, be graded and baled at any time before the 31st day of January in the year following that in which such tobacco has been cultivated;
- (b) any leaf tobacco, other than fumigated tobacco, in the possession of any grower shall, within twenty-one days from the 31st day of October in the year following that in which it has been cultivated, be transported to any of the Customs Houses at Famagusta, Larnaca, Limassol, Paphos or Kyrenia at the option of the grower or, with the permission of the Comptroller, to a tobacco warehouse.
