THE DEFENCE (CONTROL OF SALE PRICES OF SCHEDULED ARTICLES) CONSOLIDATION ORDERS, 1940 TO 1942.

NOTICE No. 250 UNDER CLAUSE 13.

The Schedule is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of Part 74 and the substitution therefor of the following Part.

“ PART 74.—METHYLATED SPIRITS.

Type of Methylated Spirit	Retail Price	Wholesale Price
Denaturated or methylated spirits (locally known as Spirito tou Kaminetou) of a minimum Strength of 80° Gay Lussac or 40° over proof ‘ Sikes’ Hydrometer ’.	3s. & 2p. per oke.	3s. per oke

In this Part of the Schedule—

the term ‘ oke ’ means one-eighth of a kouza or $1\frac{1}{8}$ quarts (as defined in the Weights and Measures Law, 1890);

the term ‘ wholesale ’ means sale or purchase of methylated spirits in quantities of not less than 10 okes or $1\frac{1}{4}$ kouzas at any one time or at any single transaction.

Modification.—Provided that where methylated spirits are sold in any village outside a radius of 3 miles of a Commissioner’s office, there may be added to the maximum retail price two piastres per oke.”
