3. Paragraph (a) of bye-law 16 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :---

"(a) on or after attaining the age of sixty years, or, in the case of voluntary retirement made with the approval of the Council, on or after attaining the age of fifty-five years;"

4. These bye-laws shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1947.

The above bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.

## THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1948.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Trikomo, in the District of Famagusta, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the Gazette.

> RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF TRIKOMO UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them under section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1948, the Village Health Commission of Trikomo hereby make the following rules :---

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Trikomo) Gazette: (Amendment) Rules, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Village Suppl. Health (Trikomo) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal No. 3A: Rules "), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Trikomo) Rules, 1938 and 1948.
