THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAWS, 1936 TO 1948.

The following rules made by the Village Health Commission of Kondea, in the District of Famagusta, and approved by the Commissioner, are published in the *Gazette*.

RULES MADE BY THE VILLAGE HEALTH COMMISSION OF KONDEA
UNDER SECTION 9.

In exercise of the powers vested in them under section 9 of the Public Health (Villages) Laws, 1936 to 1948, the Village Health Commission of Kondea hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Village Health (Kondea) (Amendment) Rules, 1948, and shall be read as one with the Village Health (Kondea) Rules, 1938 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules"), and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Village Health (Kondea) Rules, 1938 and 1948.

2. Rule 20 of the principal Rules is hereby repealed and the following rule substituted thereof :—

"Rule 20.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by the owner or the person slaughtering any animal in the slaughter-house :—

(a) for every bullock, camel, cow or ox	2	0
(b) for every goat, sheep, kid or lamb above 10 okes carcass weight	—	7
(c) for every goat, sheep, kid or lamb of 10 okes or under carcass weight	—	4
(d) for every swine of 30 okes or more	1	0
(e) for every swine of under 30 okes	—	7

(2) Every such fee shall be paid to the Inspector".
