## THE POST OFFICE LAWS, 1881 TO 1933.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2342  
MADE UNDER SECTION 6.R. E. TURNBULL,  
*Acting Governor.*

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 6 of the Post Office Laws, 1881 to 1933, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Parcels Post (Rates of Postage) (Amendment) Order, 1949, and shall be read as one with the Parcels Post (Rates of Postage) Order, 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Parcels Post (Rates of Postage) Orders, 1948 and 1949.

2. The Schedule to the principal Order is hereby amended as follows:—
- (a) by the addition thereto in its alphabetical order of the new entry set out in the First Schedule hereto;
- (b) by the deletion therefrom of the entry relating to Cyrenaica and the substitution thereof of the entry set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

## REGULATIONS MADE UNDER ARTICLE 23 (4).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by Article 23 (4) of the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Orders, 1927 to 1938, as amended by the Air Navigation (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) (Amendment) Order, 1939, and of every other power thereunto enabling, I, the Acting Governor, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Customs) Regulations, 1949.

2. The place described in the Nicosia Aerodrome Order, 1949, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 24th day of February, 1949, under Notification -No. 76, is hereby approved as a Customs aerodrome.

3. The provisions of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1948 and of any public instrument issued or made thereunder shall, so far as they are applicable, apply, and shall be deemed to have always applied, to aircraft arriving in and departing from the Colony and to goods, mails and persons carried in, landed from, or taken for conveyance out of the Colony on, such aircraft as they apply to ships arriving at and departing from the Colony, and to goods, mails and persons carried in, landed from or taken for conveyance out of the Colony on, such ships.

**THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN  
REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.**

**PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.**

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto have applied for permits under the provisions of the said Laws;

And whereas the said persons have severally given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that they desire and purpose *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which their influence might properly be exerted; and, in particular, they have undertaken that if engaged in educational work, their influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of their pupils and to make them good citizens of the British Empire:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 8 of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby grant to the persons whose names appear in the Schedule hereto a permit respectively to commence or carry on the work set down after their respective names.
