DECLARATION UNDER SECTION 2 (f).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by paragraph (f) of section 2 of the Corporate Bodies (Immovable Property Registration) Laws, 1908 to 1948, I hereby declare the Government of the United States of America to be a corporate body for the purpose of acquiring and having registered in its name, under the provisions and for the purposes of the said Laws, the building site situate at Nicosia and covered by Reg. No. A301 of 10th October, 1942.

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (CUSTODIAN) ORDERS,
1940 TO 1946.

DIRECTIONS UNDER CLAUSE 5 (2).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by clause 5 (2) of the Trading with the Enemy (Custodian) Orders, 1940 to 1946, I, the Governor, do hereby authorize the Custodian of Enemy Property to release any monies paid over to, and held by him under the aforesaid Orders for the benefit of persons who have ceased to reside in an enemy territory and have established themselves in Cyprus or any other part of the British Commonwealth or for the benefit of persons residing in any enemy territory which has ceased to be treated as such and pay over the same to the persons who would have been entitled thereto but for the operation of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945, or any Order made thereunder.

These directions shall be deemed to have been given on the third September, 1945.
