THE SUMMER RESORTS (DEVELOPMENT) LAWS, 1938 AND 1946.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2408

MADE UNDER SECTION 25 (a) (i).

*Authority to the Summer Resort Development Board of Platres to utilize
an authorized loan for different purposes.*

Whereas by an Order in Council No. 2365 of the 29th June, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") published under Notification No. 253 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 7th July, 1949, the Acting Governor in Council gave authority to the Summer Resort Development Board of Platres (hereinafter referred to as "the Board"), to contract, *inter alia*, a loan of ten thousand pounds (£10,000) to be utilized for the purposes specified in paragraph (b) of clause 1 of the Order on the terms and conditions therein specified;

And whereas it is now desirable to utilize the said loan for other purposes in substitution for those mentioned above and the Board has now applied for authority in this respect under section 25 (a) (i) of the Summer Resorts (Development) Laws, 1938 and 1946:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 25 (a) (i) of the Summer Resorts (Development) Laws, 1938 and 1946, and of every other power thereunto enabling, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the Order be amended by the deletion therefrom of paragraph (b) of clause 1 thereof and the substitution therefor of the following paragraph:—

- "(b) that the sum of ten thousand pounds mentioned in clause 1 (1) above shall be utilized by the Board for the following purposes, that is to say:—
