NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 66.

It is hereby notified that, by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 66 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1948, and duly deputed to me, I hereby approve the premises described in the third column of the Schedule hereto, belonging to the persons whose names are set out in the first column of that Schedule and occupied by the persons whose names are set out in the second column of that Schedule, to be private warehouses for the warehousing of the goods specified in the fourth column of the said Schedule without payment of import duties upon the first entry of such goods therein.

No. 164. THE BURIALS LAWS, 1896 AND 1937.

ORDER UNDER SECTION 1.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 1 of the Burials Laws, 1896 and 1937, and delegated to me by Notification No. 172 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th June, 1947, I, Ivan Lloyd Phillips, Commissioner of the Districts of Nicosia and Kyrenia, do hereby order that a new burial ground shall be provided, under the provisions of the said Laws, for use by the Orthodox-Christian community of the village of Evrykhon, in Nicosia District, in lieu of the burial ground now in use by the said community.
