THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' PENSIONS LAWS,

No. 323. THE ANTIQUITIES LAWS, 1935 AND 1945.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 33 (d).

In exercise of the powers vested in him by section 33 (d) of the Antiquities Laws, 1935 and 1945, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to make and hereby makes the following Regulations :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Antiquities (Admission Fees to Museums and Ancient Monuments) Regulations, 1950.

2.—(1) In these Regulations—

“resident” means any person who ordinarily resides in the Colony, and includes officers of His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces stationed in the Colony, and other ranks of His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces wherever stationed when on a visit to the Colony.

(2) Any person who claims to be a resident may be required by the person in charge of the Museum or Ancient Monument in respect of which the admission fee is payable, to furnish his name and address and it shall rest with the person in charge as hereinbefore stated to decide whether such person is a resident or not.

3. The fees prescribed in the Schedule to these Regulations shall be paid for the admission to the Museums and the Ancient Monuments specified in such Schedule :

Provided that the Director may, upon a single payment of five shillings, issue an inclusive ticket valid for a period of six months from the date of issue in the case of residents and for a period of two months from the date of issue in the case of persons other than residents for admission to the Museums and to the Ancient Monuments aforementioned during the respective periods aforesaid :

Provided also that the Director and any Commissioner may issue a pass free of any charge and valid for a period of six months from the date of issue for the free admission to any or all such Museums and Ancient Monuments—

- (a) to any person who has subscribed and paid not less than £1 to the Antiquities Fund ;
- (b) to any bona fide archaeologist ;
- (c) to any student ;
- (d) to any organized party of officers and/or other ranks of His Majesty’s Naval, Military or Air Forces wherever stationed or of the corresponding Forces of any other Power while on courtesy visits to Cyprus :

Provided also that entrance shall be free and no fees charged on Fridays at the Cyprus Museum, and on Saturdays at all other Museums and Ancient Monuments specified in the Schedule.

4. A printed ticket shall be issued to every person who pays for admission to the Museums and Ancient Monuments aforementioned.

5. Nothing in these Regulations shall apply to the following persons, who shall be admitted to the Museums and Ancient Monuments aforementioned, free of any charge, that is to say :—

- (a) members of the Antiquities Advisory Board and of the District Antiquities Committees ;
- (b) any person who visits such Museums or Ancient Monuments for some lawful business ;
- (c) children under the age of 16 when accompanied by a parent ;
- (d) organized parties of schoolchildren and the schoolteachers in charge of them ;
- (e) members of the Cyprus Police Force when in uniform.

6. The Antiquities (Admission Fees to Museums and Ancient Monuments) Regulations, 1940, are hereby revoked.

7. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st September, 1950.
