In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 57 (3) of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1948, I, the Governor's Deputy, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order that the entry in the second column of the Fourth Schedule to the aforesaid Laws (under the heading "Manner of affixing, stamping or attaching the mark of origin") relating to oranges and lemons and other citrus fruit be varied by the addition thereto of the following proviso, the full stop at the end thereof being replaced by a colon:—

"Provided that, with the approval of the Comptroller, oranges, lemons and other citrus fruit may be exported unwrapped".

## No. 435. THE COMMISSIONS OF ENQUIRY LAW, 1942.

## COMMISSION OF ENQUIRY APPOINTED UNDER SECTION 2.

O. R. ARTHUR,  
*Governor's Deputy.*

In exercise of the powers conferred upon the Governor by section 2 of the Commissions of Enquiry Law, 1942, I, the Governor's Deputy, do hereby order as follows:—

1. I hereby appoint with effect from the 12th October, 1950, a Commission of Enquiry consisting of three Commissioners, that is to say:—  
His Honour M. Zekia, President, District Court, *Chairman.*  
Mr. C. D. Severis, Advocate, Nicosia.  
Mr. L. F. Weldon, Assistant Director of Public Works.

2. The terms of reference to the Commission shall be:—

To make full enquiry and report upon the accident which occurred on Sunday the 17th of September, 1950, on the Government Railway between Nicosia Station and the Race Course, expressing an opinion as to the cause or causes of the accident, distributing responsibility on the officers of the Railway involved, and indicating what measures, if any, must be taken for the avoidance of a similar occurrence.

3. The Commission shall have all the powers set out in section 7 of the Commissions of Enquiry Law, 1942.

4. The Commission shall report to the Governor as soon as they complete their deliberations.
