THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) LAW, 1880.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 2 (1) (a) (b) (c) (g) (i) (j) AND (l).

In exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 2 (1) (a) (b) (c) (g) (i) (j) and (l) of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Law, 1880, duly deputed to me under section 4 of the said Law by the Notification No. 527 published in the *Gazette* of the 3rd July, 1931, I, the Chief Veterinary Officer, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ox Warble-Fly Control Order, 1950.

2. In this Order—

“cattle” means any bull, calf, cow, heifer or ox;

“infected area” means any area notified under section 1 of the Law to be a place infected with Ox Warble-Fly;

“Law” means the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Law, 1880;

“notice” means a notice posted by me or by any person duly authorized by me in that behalf in any conspicuous place in the village or area affected thereby.

3. Every person being the owner or person in charge of any cattle within an infected area shall cause the said cattle to be tethered or secured during such time as may be specified in a notice.

4. No cattle shall be moved from an infected area except under a permit in writing issued by me or a person duly authorized by me in that behalf.

5. No cattle which have been moved out of an infected area after such day as may be specified in a notice shall again be moved to any other place in the Colony without a permit in writing issued by me or a person duly authorized by me in that behalf.

6. In the event of the sale of any cattle to which this Order applies, the seller shall, within forty-eight hours of such sale, give a written notification thereof to the Veterinary Inspector or Stock Inspector in charge of the District in which the sale took place, stating the name and address of the purchaser of such cattle.

7. Any stray cattle found within an infected area during such time as may be specified in a notice may be slaughtered or otherwise disposed of as I may direct.

8. Every owner or person in charge of any cattle within an infected area or such neighbouring areas as I may specify in a notice shall produce such cattle for inspection and treatment at such places and at such times as shall be appointed by the Veterinary Inspector or the Stock Inspector by a notice and every such owner or person in charge shall render full assistance to the Veterinary Inspector or Stock Inspector in the inspection and treatment of such cattle.

9. For the purpose of ensuring the treatment of affected cattle, any cattle to which this Order applies may be branded or otherwise marked to my satisfaction.

10. The Ox Warble-Fly Control Order, 1950, is hereby revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder.
