THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAWS, 1930 TO 1948.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF MORPHOU.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1948, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Morphou hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1950, and shall be read as one with the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941 to 1948 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Morphou Municipal Bye-laws, 1941 to 1950.

2. Bye-law 15 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor :—

" 15. The following fees shall be paid to the Inspector by the owner or the person in charge of the following goods brought into or on sale in the Municipal Market :—

(a) Goods other than meat or pork and other than goods referred to in paragraphs (b), (c), (d) and (e) hereof—

| (i) When the value of such goods does not exceed two shillings | 1p. |
| (ii) When the value of such goods exceeds two shillings but does not exceed five shillings | 2p. |
| (iii) When the value of such goods exceeds five shillings but does not exceed ten shillings | 3p. |
| (iv) When the value of such goods exceeds ten shillings but does not exceed one pound | 4p. |

If the value of such goods exceeds one pound, a fee of 1p. for each additional five shillings or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 4p.

(b) Cereals—

- (i) When the quantity of a load of barley or oats does not exceed five kiles, a fee of 6p.
For every additional kile, 1p.
- (ii) When the quantity of a load of wheat or vetches does not exceed five kiles, a fee of one shilling.
For every additional kile, 1½p.

(c) Potatoes—

For every oke, a fee of 4 paras.

(d) Oil—

For every oke, a fee of 1p.

(e) Game—

- (i) For every hare or brace of partridges or of any other game or wild bird of similar size or for every single partridge or other game or wild bird of similar size, a fee of 2p.
- (ii) For becaficoes or other birds of similar size, for every dozen or part thereof, a fee of 2p.

3. Bye-law 133 (1) of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the figures "£0. 10s. 0p." and the substitution therefor of the figures "£0. 15s. 0p."

4. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 137 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1948) is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

" (1) Whenever all the domestic needs of all persons entitled to a supply of drinking water have been satisfied and there is a surplus

quantity of drinking water available for irrigation purposes, such surplus quantity may be disposed of by the Municipal Corporation to persons residing within the municipal limits on payment of a fee of ~~eighteen piastres~~ ^{for every hour of supply of water for irrigation or in proportion for a lesser period."}

5. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 138A of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1946) is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

"(1) The Municipal bore-hole 'Philippou' situated at Morphou, 'Stephania' locality, will be used for irrigation purposes by persons residing within the municipal limits on payment of a fee of thirty-six piastres for every hour of supply or in proportion for a lesser period."

6. Bye-laws 193 to 199, both inclusive, of the principal Bye-laws are hereby deleted.

7. Chapter 11 of Part VI and bye-laws 242 and 243 of the principal Bye-laws are hereby deleted and the following Chapter and bye-laws substituted therefor:—

"Chapter 11.—Fees for weighing, measuring and testing goods.

242.—(1) The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 184 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1948, for the weighing, measuring and testing of goods within the municipal limits, shall be the fees set forth in the Third Schedule hereto.

(2) The fees to be paid under the provisions of section 189 of the Municipal Corporations Laws, 1930 to 1948, in respect of goods brought within the municipal limits, shall be the fees set forth in the Third Schedule hereto.

243.—(1) Whenever any municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of two paras per oke in respect thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt:

Provided that—

- (a) Fractions under ten paras shall not be collected;
- (b) For fractions of ten paras and over and under thirty paras the sum of twenty paras shall be collected;
- (c) For fractions of thirty paras and over and under forty paras the sum of forty paras shall be collected:

Provided also that the minimum fee for any weighing, measuring or testing shall be one piastre.

(2) Nothing in this bye-law contained—

- (a) shall apply or shall be taken to apply to the weighing, measuring or testing of any goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto; or
- (b) shall be taken or construed to give to any municipal weigher or to the Municipal Corporation any right to demand the compulsory weighing, measuring or testing of any goods to which this bye-law applies."

The fee shall be in respect of the period ending on the 31st December of each year irrespective of the time when it becomes chargeable."

14. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 243 of the principal Bye-laws (as set out in the Morphou Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1950) is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

"(1) Whenever a municipal weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than the goods enumerated in the Third Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the municipal weigher, for the use of the Municipal Corporation, upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of 3 mils per ten shes or part thereof and such municipal weigher shall give to the person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such form as the Mayor may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the municipal weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Provided that—

- (a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and
- (b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be ten mils."

15. The Second Schedule to the principal Bye-laws (as set out in Notification No. 167, Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of 10th March, 1955) is hereby repealed and the following Schedule substituted therefor :—

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that—

(a) The fee to be collected in each case shall be a multiple of five mils ; and

(b) When such fee is not an exact multiple of five mils, the nearest multiple of five mils, whether higher or lower, shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing, measuring or testing shall be 10 mils."

The above bye-laws have been approved by His Excellency the Governor.
