3. Regulation 3 of the principal Regulations shall be varied to read and to have effect as follows:-

"3. Nothing in regulation 2 of these regulations contained shall

apply to-

(a) any goods being bona fide baggage of a passenger, the property of and accompanied by, such passenger, and proved to the satisfaction of the Comptroller that they are for the personal use of such passenger.

For the purposes of this paragraph the expression 'baggage' has the same meaning as in item 10 of the Second Schedule to the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1948 (as set out in Law 7 15 of 1948

of 1948). (b) goods to be exported to destinations within the United Winds (c) goods produced or manufactured in the Colony which are to be

exported to any destination, where the f.o.b. value of the consignment

of such goods does not exceed £25."

4.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in paragraph (b) of regulation 3 of these regulations contained the goods enumerated in the Schedule hereto shall not be exported unless a licence has been granted under the provisions of paragraph (1) of regulation 2 of these regulations.

(2) The Schedule hereto may be amended by notice published in the Gazette by direction of the Governor and upon such publication such

amendment shall form part of these regulations for all purposes.
