

5. This Licence shall not, except in the case of anything done under an authority, given generally or specially by, or by any person authorized in that behalf by, the Governor or the Accountant-General extend to or authorize any trade in respect of any contract entered into before the 6th January, 1950.

6. This Order applies—

- (i) to any Government, public or other authority in Japan,
- (ii) to any individual resident in Japan,
- (iii) as respects any business carried on in Japan, to any individual or body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate, carrying on that business.

7. For the purposes of this Order (a) "property" means real or personal property, and includes any estate or interest in real or personal property, any negotiable instrument, debt or other chose in action, and any other right or interest whether in possession or not, and (b) "Japan" means all territory which was under Japanese sovereignty on the 7th December, 1941.

8. The Orders specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

9. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 6th January, 1950.

THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY LAWS, 1939 TO 1945.

ORDER MADE BY THE ACCOUNTANT-GENERAL UNDER SECTION 6.

S. M. RICH,

*Accountant-General.*

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Trading with the Enemy Laws, 1939 to 1945 (which renders ineffective except with my sanction, the transfer by or on behalf of enemies of negotiable instruments and choses in action) do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trading with the Enemy (Transfer of Negotiable Instruments, etc.) (Japan) Order, 1950.

2. I do hereby sanction:—

- (a) any assignment of a chose in action which, on or after the 6th January, 1950, comes into the ownership of an authority or a person to whom this Order applies;
- (b) any transfer of a negotiable instrument issued on or after the 6th January, 1950; and
- (c) any transfer of any security transferable by delivery, not being a bond, a coupon or a negotiable instrument, which on or after the 6th January, 1950, comes into the ownership of an authority or person to whom this Order applies,

being an assignment or transfer made on or after the 6th January, 1950, within the authority given by the Trading with the Enemy (Authorization) (Japan) Order, 1950, by or on behalf of an authority or a person to whom this Order applies.

3. This Order shall apply—
- to any Government, public or other authority in Japan,
  - to any individual resident in Japan,
  - as respects any business carried on in Japan to any individual or body of persons, whether corporate or unincorporate, carrying on that business.
4. For the purpose of this Order "Japan" means all territory which was under Japanese sovereignty on the 7th December, 1941.
5. The Orders specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.
6. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 6th January, 1950.

THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE (EXPORT) LAW, 1933.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 8.

A. B. WRIGHT,  
Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 8 of the Agricultural Produce (Export) Law, 1933, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

- These regulations may be cited as the Agricultural Produce (Onions) Export Regulations, 1950.
- In these regulations—  
"onions" means the bulbs of *Allium cepa* Linn.;  
"Produce Inspector" means the produce inspector at the place of inspection at which the onions intended for export are submitted for examination.
- No onions shall be passed as fit for export unless they—  
  - are packed either in new well ventilated cases or in new clean Hessian bags which shall permit of adequate ventilation;
  - are packed in such a manner as to warrant arrival at their destination in a sound condition;
  - are packed in cases or bags of a weight, when packed, of 40 okes.
- (1) Any person who intends to export any onions shall give notice to the Produce Inspector at the place of exportation stating the quantity of onions which it is proposed to ship and the destination of the consignment. Such notice shall be given and the consignment presented for inspection sufficiently long in advance of the date upon which it is proposed to ship the same as to permit of the inspection being carried out during normal working hours.  
(2) The consignment properly marked for export, and each package bearing the words "Produce of Cyprus", shall be stacked at a place of inspection approved by the Director of Agriculture and in a manner suitable for inspection as may be directed by the Produce Inspector.
