SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION.

No. 16. THE CUSTOMS LAWS, 1936 TO (No. 3) 1948.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2456

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 52 of the Customs Laws, 1936 to (No. 3) 1948, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Import Duty (Collapsible Carton Boxes) Exemption Order, 1951.

2. Collapsible carton boxes, with regard to which the importer satisfies the Comptroller that they are intended for use in packing products of the Colony for export, shall be admitted into the Colony free from import duty.

THE MISSIONARY EDUCATIONAL AND MEDICAL (ALIEN
REGULATION) LAWS, 1922 AND 1933.

PERMIT UNDER SECTION 8.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, the person whose name appears in the Schedule hereto has applied for a permit under the provisions of the said Laws;

And whereas the said person has given an undertaking in writing to pay all due obedience and respect to the Government of Cyprus, and while carefully abstaining from participation in political affairs, that she desires and purposes *ex animo* to work in friendly co-operation with the said Government in all matters in which her influence

might properly be exerted; and, in particular, she has undertaken that if engaged in educational work, her influence will be exerted to promote loyalty to the Government of Cyprus in the minds of her pupils, and to make them good citizens of the British Empire:

Now, therefore, I, the Governor in Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 8 of the Missionary Educational and Medical (Alien Regulation) Laws, 1922 and 1933, do hereby grant to the person whose name appears in the first column of the Schedule hereto a permit to commence and carry on the work set down in the second column of the said Schedule.

**THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.**

APPOINTMENT OF COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by Defence Regulation 3 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, I, the Governor, do hereby appoint the Colonial Secretary to be a Competent Authority for the purposes of Defence Regulations 61, 61A, 63 and 83 as set out in the aforesaid Schedule.

2. This appointment is deemed to have been made on the 1st day of January, 1951, and it is in addition to and not in derogation of any other appointment made for the purposes of the said Defence Regulation or any of them in respect of any officer or person other than the Controller of Supplies, but without prejudice to anything done by any such officer or person.

3. The appointment made on the 9th day of January, 1951, and published under Notification No. 8 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 10th January, 1951, is hereby revoked.
