## THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950.

## BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF ASHA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950, the Improvement Board of Asha hereby make the following bye-laws :-

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Asha Bye-laws, 1951.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of this bye-law, the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Pedhoulas Bye-laws, 1951, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 14th March, 1951 (hereinafter called "the model bye-laws") shall—

 $(\alpha)$  be deemed to be by e-laws made by the Improvement Board of Asha and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the improvement area of Asha:

Provided that for the word "Pedhoulas" and for the word "Nicosia" wherever they occur in the model bye-laws, the word "Asha" and the word "Famagusta" shall be substituted respectively.

(2) The bye-laws set out in the First Appendix hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding bye-laws of the model bye-laws.

(3) The bye-laws of the model bye-laws referred to in the Second Appendix hereto have been adopted by the Improvement Board of Asha subject to the amendments specified in the said Appendix.

(4) The bye-laws of the model bye-laws mentioned in the Third Appendix hereto shall not apply to the improvement area of Asha.

FIRST APPENDIX.

(Bye-law 2 (2).)

#### BYE-LAWS TO BE SUBSTITUTED.

Bye-law 26.-(1) The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the appropriate slaughter-house, that is to say :p.

Ô (a) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox not exceeding thirty okes in weight 2 3 0 (b) For every bullock, camel, cow or ox exceeding thirty okes in weight . . 5 (c) For every kid or lamb under six okes in weight ... (d) For every goat, kid, lamb or sheep of six okes or over in weight 6 (e) For every swine not exceeding five okes in weight 9 (f) For every swine exceeding five okes in weight but not exceeding ten okes in 1 0 weight (g) For every swine exceeding ten okes in weight but not exceeding thirty okes 3 in weight

(h) For every swine exceeding thirty okes in weight ...

Provided that every owner may, after permission is obtained from the Chairman of the Board and after the animal is inspected by the inspector, slaughter such animal in his premises when such animal is to be used exclusively by the owner and his family. In every such case, a fee of 1 shilling shall be paid in lieu of the fees hereinbefore prescribed, irrespective of the weight of the animal.

Bye-law 37.-(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say :-S. p. 1

- (a) When the value of such goods is under two shillings
- (b) When the value of such goods exceeds two shillings but does not exceed four
- 2 shillings (c) When the value of such goods exceeds four shillings but does not exceed eight 3
- shillings (d) When the value of such goods exceeds eight shillings but does not exceed fifteen 4 shillings
- (e) When the value of such goods exceeds fifteen shillings but does not exceed twenty shillings
- (f) When the value of such goods exceeds twenty shillings but does not exceed forty shillings ... 6
- (g) When the value of such goods exceeds forty shillings but does not exceed eighty 1 0 shillings

(2) If the value of such goods exceeds  $\pounds 4$ , a fee of 5p. for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of one shilling.

Bye-law 51.-(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say :p. 1 Ô

- (a) For every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof (b) For every carcass of a young lamb or kid of less than 6 okes in weight or part
- 4 thereof (c) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof not exceeding 0 1 30 okes in weight ......
- (d) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof exceeding 30 okes 2 in weight ... .. ... . . . . ... ...

(c) For fractions of 30 paras and over and under 40 paras the sum of 40 paras shall be collected :

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing or measuring or testing shall be 1cp.
