THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS)
(CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946.

ORDER MADE BY A COMPETENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 61.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Defence Regulation 61 as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946 (which continues in force in consequence of the Supplies and Services (Continuance) Order, 1950), I hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Supplies and Services (Bakeries, Bread and Wheat Control) (Amendment) Order, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Supplies and Services (Bakeries, Bread and Wheat Control) Order, 1949 (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Order”) and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Supplies and Services (Bakeries, Bread and Wheat Control) Orders, 1949 and 1951.

2. Clause 9 of the principal Order is hereby repealed and the following paragraph substituted therefor:—

“9.—(1) Notwithstanding anything in any other public instrument contained no person shall sell or purchase any bread in any town or village in the Colony at a price in excess of the price specified in paragraph (2) of this clause and otherwise than in loaves weighing—

- (i) one-half kilogram, or
- (ii) one kilogram.

(2) The price ex-oven at which any bread shall be sold or purchased in the Colony with effect from the 1st July, 1951, shall not exceed—

(a) in any town—

- (i) three piastres for each loaf of one-half kilogram ;
- (ii) six piastres for each loaf of one kilogram.

(b) in any village—

- (i) three piastres and ten paras for each loaf of one-half kilogram ;
- (ii) six and a half piastres for each loaf of one kilogram.

(3) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to what are commonly known as *koullouria* or *paximadia*.”

THE SHEEP AND GOATS (SHEPHERDS' LICENSING AND CONTROL) LAW, 1948.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 12.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 12 of the Sheep and Goats (Shepherds' Licensing and Control) Law, 1948, I hereby direct that during the period between the 15th July, 1951, and the 30th November, 1951, flocks within the area of Akanthou village in the District of Famagusta, shall, between the hours of sunset and sunrise, be kept inside an enclosure and not taken outside an enclosure :

Provided that nothing in this notice contained shall prevent the driving of any flock, under the proper charge of a licensed shepherd, from one village area to another, along any public road, at any hour.
