NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas by Notification dated 28th June, 1947, and published under No. 186 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 3rd July, 1947, the Governor declared under sections 2 and 3 of the Land Acquisition Laws, 1899 to 1947, now sections 2, 3 and 5 of Cap. 233 (hereinafter referred to as "the Law"), the erection, within the District of Larnaca, of a power station, offices, workmen's quarters and any other erections or structures as are from time to time considered to be necessary in connection with a scheme for the generation and supply of electricity in Cyprus (hereinafter referred to as "the scheme") to be an undertaking of public utility;

And whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest and for the purpose of the scheme to erect within the District of Nicosia another power station and such other erections or structures as may from time to time be considered necessary in connection with the scheme :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Law, I, the Acting Governor, do hereby declare the erection, within the District of Nicosia, of a power station and such other erections or structures as are from time to time considered to be necessary for the scheme to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust to the Chief Engineer, Central Electrification Scheme, the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking.
