## No. 444. THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950, the Improvement Board of Kambos hereby make the following bye-laws :--

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kambos (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1951, and shall be read Suppl. No. 3: as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kambos Bve-laws, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Kambos Bye-laws, 1951.

2. Bye-law 187 of the principal Bye-laws, as set out in the First Appendix thereto, is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words " 30th day of June" and the substitution therefor of the words "30th day of October ".

3. Bye-law 189 of the principal Bye-laws, as set out in the Villages Gazetter (Administration and Improvement) Pedhoulas Bye-laws, 1951, is hereby Suppl. No. 3: amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "31st day of October" 14.3.1951 and the substitution therefor of the words "30th day of November".

#### No. 446. THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF EVDHIMOU.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950, the Improvement Board of Evdhimou hereby make the following bye-laws :---

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Evdhimou Bye-laws, 1951.

2.-(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this bye-law, the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Pedhoulas Bye-laws, 1951, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 14th March, 1951 (hereinafter called "the model bye-laws") shall—

- (a) be deemed to be by e-laws made by the Improvement Board of Evdhimou and to be incorporated herein, and
- (b) apply to the improvement area of Evdhimou:

Provided that for the word "Pedhoulas" and for the word "Nicosia" wherever they occur in the model bye-laws, the word "Evdhimou" and the word "Limassol" shall be substituted respectively.

(2) The bye-laws set out in the First Appendix hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding bye-laws of the model laws.

(3) The bye-laws of the model bye-laws mentioned in the Second Appendix hereto shall not apply to the improvement area of Evdhimou.

Bye-law 176. Nothing in this Part of these bye-laws contained shall apply to any dog licensed in any other improvement area or under the provisions of the Municipal Corporations Law (Cap. <sup>252</sup>), or of the Dogs Law (Cap. 81), and wearing the metal badge or duplicate metal badge supplied by the Improvement Board of such area or the appropriate authority under the provisions of the said Laws.

Bye-law 178.-(1) Whenever any authorized weigher is requested by any person to weigh, measure or test any goods other than any of the goods enumerated in the Second Schedule hereto, such person shall pay to the authorized weigher upon such weighing, measuring or testing a fee at the rate of two paras per oke in respect thereof and such authorized weigher shall give to the Person paying the same a printed receipt in respect thereof from a counterfoil book in such <sup>form</sup> as the Board may from time to time prescribe and every person paying any such fee shall require the authorized weigher to whom the same is paid to furnish him with such printed receipt :

Bye-law 187. The Board shall on or before the 1st day of May in each year prepare a list (hereinafter in this Part of these bye-laws referred to as "the occupiers list") showing the name, occupation and place of abode of every occupier in the improvement area and the amount of the annual rate assessed on each such occupier. The occupiers list shall be dated and signed by the Chairman.

Bye-law 189. Every occupier in the improvement area whose name appears in the occupiers list shall on or before the 30th day of November pay to the Chairman or to the Treasurer of the Board the amount of the annual rate assessed on such occupier.

Bye-law 214. The Board shall in every year charge on and pay out of the revenues of the Board a sum of  $\pounds 10$  into the Gratuities and Pension Fund : Provided that the Board may from time to time increase, reduce or suspend the above payment as circumstances may require.

### No. 447. THE WATER (DOMESTIC PURPOSES) VILLAGE SUPPLIES LAW. CAP. 311.

Bye-laws made by the Water Commission of Lemona Village under Section 29.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 29 of the Water (Domestic Purposes) Village Supplies Law, the Water Commission of Lemona village hereby make the following bye-laws :---

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Village Domestic Water Supply (Lemona) Byelaws, 1951.

2.-(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this bye-law, the Village Domestic Water Supply (Elea) Bye-laws, 1950, published in the *Gazette* of 1st November, 1950, shall—

(a) be deemed to be bye-laws made by the Water Commission of Lemona and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the village of Lemona.

(2) The bye-laws set out in Part I of the Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the <sup>corresponding</sup> bye-laws of the Village Domestic Water Supply (Elea) Bye-laws, 1950.

(3) Those bye-laws of the Village Domestic Water Supply (Elea) Bye-laws, 1950, mentioned in Part II of the Schedule hereto, shall not apply to the village of Lemona.
