**No. 97. THE ANTIQUITIES LAWS, 1935 AND 1945.**

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2465  
MADE UNDER SECTION 6 (1).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 (1) of the Antiquities Laws, 1935 and 1945, I, the Governor, on the recommendation of the Director of Antiquities, and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby direct that the ancient monument specified as item 4 of the Larnaca District in the Second Schedule to the said Laws (relating to the Pyla Tower) be transferred from the Second Schedule to the said Laws to the First Schedule thereto as item 11 of the Larnaca District, therein.

**No. 98. THE ELECTRICITY LAW, 1940.**

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 10.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 10 of the Electricity Law, 1940, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Electricity (Amendment) Regulations, 1951, and shall be read as one with the Electricity Regulations, 1941 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Electricity Regulations, 1941 and 1951.

2. Regulation 11 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein at the end thereof of the following paragraph:—

"(6) Notwithstanding anything contained in these Regulations or in any other regulation made under section 10 of the Electricity Law, 1940, overhead lines shall be erected in accordance with the latest appropriate British Standard Specifications."

3. Paragraph (1) of regulation 29 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom (lines 4 and 5) of the words "and danger notices in English, Greek and Turkish,".
