Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to carry out certain improvements to the Limassol Port, to provide access roads thereto and to acquire in connection therewith certain lands situated in the town of Limassol:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, I, the Governor, do hereby declare the carrying out of improvements to the said port, the provision of the said access roads and the acquisition of the said lands to be an undertaking of public utility and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking and do hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to the Director of Public Works.

THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS) REGULATIONS, 1943 TO 1948.

### OPEN GENERAL IMPORT LICENCE No. 23350.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of the Defence (Importation of Goods) Regulations, 1943 to 1948, I hereby grant to any importer registered under the provisions of the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Imported Articles) Orders, 1943 to (No. 2) 1949, an Open General Import Licence under No. 23350 to import into the Colony in any quantity any of the goods enumerated in the Schedule hereto and originating in the following countries:—

Austria, Belgium (including its overseas dependent territories), Denmark, Eire, France (including its overseas dependent territories), Greece, Western Germany, Holland (including its overseas dependent territories), Italy, Iceland, Luxemburg, Norway, Portugal (including its overseas dependent territories), Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey and Trieste.

Provided that in all cases covered by this licence payment for the goods shall be made in sterling.

- 2. This Open General Import Licence is deemed to be a written licence issued by me under regulation 2 (1) (a) of the Defence (Importation of Goods) Regulations, 1943 to 1948, and is subject to the provisions of regulation 2 (1) (b) of the said Regulations.
- 3. The Open General Licence No. 10850 published under Notification No. 490 to the *Gazette* of 22nd November, 1950, and the Open General Licence No. 12450 published under Notification No. 20 to the *Gazette* of 17th January, 1951, are hereby cancelled.
