NOTICE UNDER SECTIONS 2, 3 AND 5.

Whereas it has been represented to me that it is desirable in the public interest to maintain and use in or near the villages of Tymbou and Palekythro in the District of Nicosia, an airfield, a plan of which is deposited in the office of the Director of Land Registration and Surveys under Government Survey Plan Serial No. 1551 (hereinafter referred to as "the Tymbou airfield") the cost whereof is to be borne by Her Majesty's Air Force Authorities ;

And whereas for the maintenance and use of the Tymbou airfield certain lands more particularly defined as all the privately owned lands within the area coloured red on the Government Survey Plan Serial No. 1551 are needed :

Cap. 233 Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 2, 3 and 5 of the Land Acquisition Law, I, the Governor, do hereby declare the maintenance and use of the Tymbou airfield and the acquisition of the said lands in connection therewith to be an undertaking of public utility, and do hereby authorize the carrying out of the said undertaking, under the provisions of the aforesaid Law, and do hereby entrust the supervision and effectuation of the said undertaking to Mr. Percy George Crosby Farrell, the Deputy Assistant Director of Hirings and Disposals (fixed assets), H.Q. Cyprus District, or in his absence to the person acting for the time being as Deputy Assistant Director of Hirings and Disposals (fixed assets), H.Q. Cyprus District.

No. 230. THE BOMBARDMENT RANGE AREAS LAW.
CAP. 222 AND LAW 23 OF 1951.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 2.

Whereas by a notice published under notification No. 395 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 1st August, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal notice") the Bombardment Range Area described in the Schedule thereto was declared to be a Bombardment Range Area for the purposes of the Bombardment Range Areas Law (hereinafter referred to as "the Law") for a period of twelve months from the date of the principal notice ;

And whereas it is desirable to prolong the date of the operation of the principal notice for further twelve months as from the date of its expiration :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Law, I, the Governor, do hereby declare that the Bombardment Range Area declared under the principal notice shall continue to be a Bombardment Range Area for the purposes of the Law for a further period of twelve months as from the 27th day of July, 1952.
