

No. 262. THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATIONS LAW.
CAP. 252 AND LAWS 11 of 1950 AND 31 of 1951.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE COUNCIL OF THE MUNICIPAL CORPORATION OF PAPHOS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by the Municipal Corporations Law, and otherwise, the Council of the Municipal Corporation of Paphos hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Paphos Municipal (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1952, and shall be read as one with the Paphos Municipal Bye-laws, 1943 to 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Paphos Municipal Bye-laws, 1943 to 1952.

2. Paragraph (1) of bye-law 92 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following paragraph substituted therefor :—

"(1) All places situated within the municipal limits and lying between the following boundaries, that is to say, Konya Street upto the premises of Mr. A. Green Bey & Kanikkos Street are hereby provided as public fair markets during the day or time that any fair is being held, within the municipal limits."

3. Sub-paragraph (d) of paragraph (1) of bye-law 108 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby deleted and the following sub-paragraph substituted therefor :—

"(d) sell bread only in loaves weighing one kilogram or half a kilogram ;"

4. Bye-law 258 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the addition thereto immediately after paragraph (2) of the following paragraph :—

"(3) Any person who desires to exhibit upon his own premises or upon any premises in his occupation, any notice or advertisement relating to his business, profession or trade carried on in those premises, shall first apply to the Mayor for approval by him of the form (including siting) and size of such notice or advertisement. Every such application shall be submitted in duplicate and shall be in the Form F in the First Schedule hereto and shall contain the particulars therein set out and the Mayor may give or refuse approval thereof or may indicate to the applicant what modifications to the notice or advertisement should be effected before approval is given :

Provided that no approval shall be granted in respect of any notice or advertisement exceeding 4 feet by 4 feet in size."

5. The principal Bye-laws are hereby amended by the insertion therein immediately after bye-law 269 of the following Chapter and bye-laws :—

" Chapter 6A.—Municipal Garden.

269A. The place or space situated within the municipal limits and bounded by Limassol Street, Victoria Street and Ioannis Metaxas Street is hereby provided as a municipal garden.

269B. No person shall, without the consent or authority of the Mayor previously obtained, within the municipal garden—

- (a) ride any bicycle or tricycle or lead, drive, ride or take any other vehicle or animal ;
- (b) play in any place of such garden not specially reserved by the Mayor for play ;
- (c) enter any place of such garden the entrance to which is prohibited by the Mayor ;

(d) cut, destroy, damage or injure or cause or allow or suffer to be cut, destroyed, damaged or injured any plants, trees, flowers, hedges, buildings, benches or other parts of such municipal garden or property of the municipal corporation."

6. The First Schedule to the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the addition thereto, immediately after Form E, of the following Form :—

" *Form F.—(Bye-law 258 (3)).*
