- 1. This Order may be cited as the Shop Assistants (Hours of Employment) Variation Order, 1952.
- 2. Every shop assistant to whom section 7 of the Law applies shall not be employed in any capacity whatsoever for a longer period than fifty hours, excluding meal times, in any one week, in lieu of the period therein provided:

Provided that a shop assistant who has not attained the age of sixteen years shall not be employed for a longer period than forty-four hours, excluding meal times, in any one week.

      - (i) from Monday to Friday (both days inclusive) in every week not later than 8.00 p.m.;
