THE MINIMUM WAGE LAW. CAP. 215.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2558 MADE UNDER SECTION 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 3 of the Minimum Wage Law, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby Cap. 215 order as follows:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Minimum Wage (Shop and Office Gazette: Employees) (Amendment) Order, 1952, and shall be read as one with the Suppl. No. 3: Minimum Wage (Shop and Office Employees) Order, 1951 (hereinafter 21.11.1951 referred to as "the principal Order"), and the principal Order and this Order may together be cited as the Minimum Wage (Shop and Office Employees) Orders, 1951 and 1952.

2. The principal Order is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of clause 2 and the substitution therefor of the following clause:—

"2. The minimum rates of wages to be paid in the Colony in respect of the categories of shop and office employees mentioned in the first column of the Schedule hereto shall be the rates mentioned in the second column of such Schedule:

Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to persons employed in any shop or office in any village, other than a village which is a municipal corporation or an improvement area."

THE GAME AND WILD BIRDS PROTECTION LAW. CAP. 98 AND LAW 23 OF 1950.

> ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2559 MADE UNDER SECTIONS 2 AND 3.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by sections 2 and 3 of the Game Cap. 98 and Wild Birds Protection Law, I, the Governor, with the advice of the 23 of 1950 Executive Council, do hereby prescribe that the periods specified in the

Schedule hereto shall be a close season in addition to the close season as defined in section 2 of the Law.

SCHEDULE.

1. The period between the 1st day of October, 1952 and 31st day of October, 1952, both days inclusive.

2. The period between the 16th day of January, 1953 and 31st day of

January, 1953, both days inclusive.

3. All days in the week during a non close season except Wednesdays and Sundays.

THE BOATS REGULATION LAW.

In exercise of the powers vested in me under section 8 of the Boats Regulation Law, I, the Governor, do hereby make the following regulations.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Boats (Amendment) Regulations, 1952, and shall be read as one with the Boats Regulations, 1946 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Boats Regulations, 1946 and 1952.

2. Regulation 22 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the words "one hundred" (line 3) and the sub-

stitution therefor of the words "two hundred".

THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Alona to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950, I, the Colonial Secretary, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Improvement Board of Alona (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding eight hundred and fifty pounds (£850) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:

(a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in ten equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and

interest);

(b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for improving the village water supply.
