NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 65.

NOTICE UNDER SECTION 6.

With reference to the notification published under No. 229 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* No. 3628 of 11th June, 1952, notice is hereby given that the following lands are required by the Governor for the undertaking of public utility mentioned therein, that is for the Tymbou Airfield:—
