Whereas on the report of the Director of Education it appears to me that it is desirable to compel the Committee of Management for the Maronite Schools (hereinafter referred to as "the Committee") to repair and improve the school premises in the villages of Kormakiti and Asomatos in the District of Kyrenia (hereinafter referred to as "the school premises"):

**No. 452. THE EMERGENCY POWERS (CYPRUS DEFENCE) (FINANCE)**  
**REGULATIONS, 1940 TO 1949.**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by regulation 5A of the Emergency Powers (Cyprus Defence) (Finance) Regulations, 1940 to 1949, I, the Governor, do hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Cyprus Currency Notes (Prohibition of Import) Order, 1952.
2. On and after the 16th October, 1952, no person shall import into the Colony except under licence issued by the Exchange Officer or any other person authorized by him in that behalf any Cyprus Currency Notes.

**No. 453. THE PRISON DISCIPLINE LAW.**

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 2 of the Prison Discipline Law, I, the Governor, do hereby approve and direct that, in addition to the police stations of the villages set out in the Schedule to the notice published under Notification No. 254 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 13th July, 1950, the police station in the village of Yialia in the District of Paphos be set apart as a prison for prisoners liable to serve a sentence not exceeding fourteen days.
