## THE QUARANTINE LAW. CAP. 145.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2589 MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 6 of the Quarantine Law Cap. 145. and of every other power thereunto enabling, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Quarantine Regulations published under Notification No. 6424 in the *Gazette* of the 19th December, 1902, whereby certain Quarantine dues were fixed in respect of vessels.

2. This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 6th December, 1952.

THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950.

## ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Kambos to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950, I, the Colonial Secretary, do hereby order as follows :—

1. The Improvement Board of Kambos (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding three hundred pounds (£300) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—

(a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in five equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);

(b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the purchase of a site for the erection of a public market.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

# THE DEFENCE (IMPORTATION OF GOODS) REGULATIONS, 1943 TO 1948.

#### OPEN GENERAL LICENCE NO. 39300.

Whereas by an open general licence No. 23350 published under Notification No. 165 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th March, 1952, as amended by open general licence No. 35000 published under Notification No. 455 in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 15th October, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal licence") an open licence for the importation into the Colony in any quantity of the goods enumerated in the Schedule thereto and originating from the countries therein mentioned was granted to any importer registered under the provisions of the Defence (Control of Sale Prices of Imported Articles) Orders, 1943. to (No. 2) 1948.

And whereas it is desirable that some further provisions be made in this respect :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of the Defence (Importation of Goods) Regulations, 1943 to 1948, I hereby direct that the list of countries be amended by the deletion therefrom of the words EIRE and ICELAND and by the deletion of the words which appear in Column "A" hereof from the Groups and Classes in the Principal Licence, which appear in Column "B" hereof.

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Column " A "	Column " B "
(a) Fruit juices including lime juice, syrups, etc.	Group G in Class I.
(b) Iron and steel scrap	Group C in Class II.
(c) Cotton, ginned Cotton waste	Group F in Class II.

2. This licence shall be read together and shall be construed as one with the principal licence which, subject to the aforesaid amendments, shall remain in full force and effect.
