No. 86. THE PUBLIC HEALTH (VILLAGES) LAW. CAP. 142.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2525 MADE UNDER SECTION 2.

THE FISHERIES LAW. CAP. 88 AND LAW 21 OF 1951.

ORDER IN COUNCIL No. 2526
MADE UNDER SECTION 6.

A. B. WRIGHT, Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by the Fisheries Law, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Fisheries Regulations, 1952.
- 2. In these regulations—
 "Comptroller" includes any officer duly authorized by the Comptroller for the purpose of these regulations.
- 3. The master or owner of a vessel for which a licence is desired for the purpose of taking fish in the Colony under the provisions of the Law shall make an application in writing to the Comptroller containing a brief description of the yessel for which such licence is required.

- 4. Every licence issued under the provisions of the Law shall be in the form set out in the Schedule hereto, and shall contain the particulars therein set out. Such licence shall be carried on the vessel and produced to any Police or Customs Officer on demand.
- 5.—(1) Every vessel licensed for the purpose of taking fish in the Colony under the provisions of the Law shall bear such number as may be given to such vessel by the Comptroller plainly painted, in white figures on a black ground, on each side of such vessel, on the swell of the bow thereof and in black figures on each side of the sail or the main sail thereof as the case may be.

Such figures shall be at least ten inches in height and one inch in breadth of stroke and they shall be at least thirteen and a half inches in height and

two inches in breadth of stroke, respectively.

(2) Every vessel licensed as aforesaid shall, while out fishing at night, exhibit a white light which must be visible all round the horizon for a

distance of at least one mile:

Provided that every vessel licensed as aforesaid propelled by machinery shall, while out trawling at night, exhibit in the place of the white light (a) a tricoloured lantern so constructed and fixed as to show a white light from right ahead to two points on each bow, and a green light and a red light over an arc of the horizon from two points on each bow to two points abaft the beam, on the starboard and port sides, respectively; and (b) not less than six nor more than twelve feet below the tricoloured lantern a white light in a lantern, so constructed as to show a clear, uniform and unbroken light all round the horizon.

For the purposes of this paragraph "trawling" means dragging an apparatus along the bottom of the sea.

- (3) All vessels licensed as aforesaid fishing with nets or lines or trawls, shall, when under way, in daytime indicate their occupation to an approaching vessel by displaying a basket or other efficient signal where it can best be seen, and when they have their gear out while at anchor, on approach of other vessels, show the same signal on the side on which those vessels can pass.
 - 6. The Comptroller may from time to time—
 - (a) limit the number of licences to be issued in any year to trawlers for the purpose of taking fish in the Colony;
 - (b) select the applicants to whom such licences may be issued where the number of applicants exceeds the limited number of the licences:

Provided that such limited number of licences shall not, in any year, be more than ten, and the Comptroller shall, in the selection of the applicants to whom such licences may be issued, give, in the absence of good reason to the contrary, priority to those applicants who, during the ten years immediately preceding the year in which the applications are made, obtained the greater number of licences.

- 7.—(1) No person shall, for the purpose of taking fish in the Colony, employ or use any net, the minimum size of the mesh of which shall be such that when the mesh is stretched diagonally lengthwise, a flat gauge of three-quarters of an inch in width and one thirtysecond of an inch in thickness shall not pass through it easily when the net is wet.
- (2) No person shall take, land or sell fish in the Colony of a size which is not retained by the mesh prescribed in paragraph (1) of this regulation:

Provided that this regulation shall not apply to the fish known as "white-bait" when such fish has been taken by basket traps.

8. No person shall kill, take, pursue, or attempt to kill, take, pursue, or possess, or sell any trout or other non-native species of fish introduced by the Government of Cyprus into any fresh water in the Colony without the authority in writing of the Conservator of Forests.

- 9. No trawler shall fish during the months of June, July and August in any year.
- 10. No trawler shall fish in the territorial waters of the Colony, where the depth of water is less than 30 fathoms.
- 11. These regulations shall come into operation on the 22nd day Gazette: of February, 1952, and thereupon the Fisheries Regulations, 1932, 24.3.1932 shall be revoked without prejudice to anything done or left undone thereunder:

Provided that any licences issued during the current year shall remain in force until the 31st day of December, 1952.

No. 88. THE COURTS OF JUSTICE LAW. CAP. 11 AND LAW 2 OF 1952.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 16 (4).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 16 (4) of the Courts Cap. 11 of Justice Law, I, the Governor, do hereby order that the limit of the civil Law2 of 1952 jurisdiction of Mr. Lefkios E. Zenon, President of the District Court of Larnaca, when sitting alone as President of the District Court of Larnaca or as Additional President of the District Courts of Nicosia, Kyrenia, Famagusta, Limassol and Paphos, be increased from two hundred pounds to five hundred pounds.
