Authority to the Improvement Board of Peyia to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Law, 1950, I, the Colonial Secretary, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Improvement Board of Peyia (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding two thousand

pounds (£2,000) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lender in fifteen equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest):

- 2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lenders all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.
