COMPULSORY ACQUISITION ORDER.  
THE ANTIQUITIES LAW (CAP. 43)—(SECTION 12)  
AND  
THE LAND ACQUISITION LAW (CAP. 233).

Whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that in order to preserve the amenities of certain ancient monuments in the old town of Famagusta, that is to say the church of St. Anne, the Tabak Khane Mesjit and the west rampart, it is desirable that no building should be erected in the proximity of the said ancient monuments upon the plot of land described in the Schedule hereto and that any buildings thereon should be demolished;

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 12 of the Antiquities Law (Cap. 43), His Excellency the Governor is pleased to direct and hereby directs that the property described in the Schedule hereto be acquired on payment of such amount by way of compensation as may be agreed upon between the Commissioner of Famagusta and the proprietors thereof and that in default of agreement within one month from the date hereof the amount of compensation be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Land Acquisition Law (Cap. 233).
