No. 360. THE CUSTOMS LAW.
CAP. 292 AND LAWS 5 OF 1952 AND 19 AND 27 OF 1953.

NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 65.

It is hereby notified that, by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 65 of the Customs Law and duly deputed to the Colonial Secretary, I, the Acting Colonial Secretary, hereby approve the premises described in the first column of the Schedule hereto, belonging to Mrs. Keti Cratinos Mitsingas of Famagusta, and occupied by the Navy, Army and Air Force Institutes, Cyprus, to be a private warehouse for the warehousing of the goods specified in the second column of the said Schedule without payment of import duties upon the first entry of such goods therein.

CAP. 53.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 15.

Whereas in pursuance of Notification No. 227 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 11th June, 1948, a fit and proper site has been registered in the books of the Land Registry Office for use as a burial ground by the Moslem community of the village of Sarama, in the District of Paphos :

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 15 of the Burials Law, and duly delegated to me under Notification No. 172, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th June, 1947, I do hereby order that no burial shall take place in the burial ground in lieu whereof the new burial ground above referred to has been provided.
