NOTICE UNDER SECTION 36 (2).

Notice is hereby given that the following immovable property is required by the Board of the Palouriotissa Improvement Area for the erection thereon of a public market:—

All that area of privately-owned immovable property situated at Palouriotissa village, in the District of Nicosia, including the building sites under plots Nos. 228 and 229 of Block "A", Palouriotissa Village, comprising 3 evleks and 520 sq. feet or thereabouts, more particularly defined as the area coloured red on the plan marked "Public Market, Palouriotissa", dated 8th July, 1953, deposited with the Commissioner of Nicosia and Kyrenia.

Any person claiming to have any right or interest in the said immovable property, who objects to the acquisition of such property, is required within six weeks from the date of the posting of this notice to send to me a statement of his right and interest and of the evidence thereof, and of any claim made by him in respect of such right or interest.
