No. 446. THE COMPANIES RULES OF COURT, 1953.

J. FLETCHER-COOKE,
Acting Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 37 of the Courts of Justice (Supplementary Provisions) Law, and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, I, the Acting Governor, with the advice and assistance of the Acting Chief Justice, do hereby make the following rules :—

1. These rules may be cited as the Companies Rules of Court, 1953, and shall be read as one with the Companies Rules of Court, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Rules") and the principal Rules and these rules may together be cited as the Companies Rules of Court, 1951 and 1953.

2. For paragraph (d) of rule 6 of the principal Rules there shall be substituted the following paragraph :—

"(d) Applications for a declaration that the affairs of a company ought to be investigated under section 158 of the Law. Notice of such an application shall be served on the company and the Attorney-General".
