BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF TROODOS.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Law, 1950, the Improvement Board of Troodos hereby make the following bye-laws :—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Troodos) (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1953, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Troodos) Bye-laws, 1951 and 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Troodos) Bye-laws, 1951 to 1953.
