ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 22 (a) (i).

Authority to the Improvement Board of Dhiorios to contract a loan.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Law, 1950, I, the Colonial Secretary, do hereby order as follows:—

1. The Improvement Board of Dhiorios (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lender") a sum not exceeding one hundred and forty-four pounds (£144) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions that is to say:—

- (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lender in four equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
- (b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the erection of a slaughter-house.

2. For the purpose of securing the repayment of the sum under the loan, the Board shall, subject to any prior mortgage thereon, mortgage to the Lender all the rates, fees, rents, tolls or charges now payable or hereafter to become payable to the Board.

ORDER MADE UNDER SECTION 15.

Whereas in pursuance of Notification No. 408 published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 17th September, 1952, a fit and proper site has been registered in the books of the Land Registry Office as a burial ground for the burial of the dead by the Greek-Orthodox community of Ayios Loucas Quarter of Famagusta Town:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in the Governor by section 15 of the Burials Law, and duly delegated to me under Notification No. 172, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 19th June, 1947, I do hereby order that from and after the 24th September, 1953, no burial shall take place in the burial ground in lieu whereof the new burial ground above referred to has been provided.
