THE AIR TRANSPORT (LICENSING OF AIR SERVICES)  
REGULATIONS, 1948 TO 1953.

(First Schedule, paragraph 5.)

NOTICE ISSUED BY THE LICENSING AUTHORITY.

Notice is hereby given to all persons concerned that an application has been made to the Licensing Authority by Messrs. Skyways Ltd., of 7 Berkeley Street, London, W.1, for a licence to use aircraft in Cyprus for provision of air service, in accordance with the particulars mentioned hereinbelow :—

Places between which passengers or goods are to be carried :—

LONDON—NICOSIA and vice versa.

MALTA—NICOSIA and vice versa.

Places at which intermediate landings are to be made for the purpose of loading or landing passengers or goods :—

MALTA : With traffic rights on the Sector MALTA—NICOSIA and vice versa but not on the Sector LONDON—MALTA and vice versa.

Times of frequency of the service :—

Once fortnightly in each direction.

Date on which the service is to commence :—

LONDON—NICOSIA, Wednesday 11th November, 1953, and thereafter fortnightly.

NICOSIA—LONDON, Thursday 12th November, 1953, and thereafter fortnightly.

Period for which the licence is applied for :—

TWO YEARS.

2. Any representation or objection with regard to the said application should be made in writing to the Licensing Authority c/o the Secretary to the Licensing Authority, Colonial Secretary's Office, Nicosia, not later than the 23rd October, 1953.

Nicosia, the 8th of October, 1953.

NOTES.—(1) A representation or objection should state the specific grounds on which it is based and should specify any conditions which it may be desired should be attached to the licence if granted. If the representation or objection is made by a corporate body or partnership firm, it should be signed by a person duly authorized in that behalf by such body or a partner of the partnership firm, as the case may be. A copy of every such representation or objection should be sent by the person making the same to the Applicant(s) for the licence at the same time as it is sent to the Licensing Authority.

2. Any person who has made a representation or objection may require the Licensing Authority to hold an enquiry in public for the purpose of determining the application, by sending to the Licensing Authority at the above address a notice in writing in that behalf, which should reach the Licensing Authority not later than the 31st October, 1953.
