

- (c) to recover and sue for any such monies or property as aforesaid and to enforce any rights or interests vested in the said Administrator as aforesaid,
- (d) to compromise any matter and to accept any composition or any payment or transfer on account,
- (e) generally to do any act or thing that may be necessary or proper for reducing to possession recovering or protecting any such property, rights and interests as aforesaid, or for enforcing or making effective and complete the vesting effected by this Order and carrying out the powers, rights and duties of the said Administrator in connection with the same.

No. 646. THE CUSTOMS LAW.
CAP. 292 AND LAWS 5 OF 1952, 19 OF 1953 AND 27 OF 1953,

THE CUSTOMS HOUSES (DAYS AND HOURS OF BUSINESS) ORDER, 1953.

OVERTIME WORK AND FEES.

In exercise of the powers vested in the Comptroller by section 6 (4) of the Customs Law, I hereby prescribe that from and after the 3rd January, 1954, overtime at the rates prescribed in the Schedule hereto shall be charged for the services of Customs Officers where permitted to carry out overtime outside the hours and days prescribed in clauses 2 and 3 of the Customs Houses (Days and Hours of Business) Order, 1953.

2. Overtime charges shall be calculated in full for each vessel or operation requiring the attendance of Customs Officers without reference to the number of vessels or operations being worked in any period.

3. Notifications Nos. 155 and 176, published in Supplements No. 3 to *Gazette* No. 3366 of the 15th April, 1948, and No. 3370 of the 6th May, 1948, respectively, are cancelled as from the 3rd January, 1954.

The above charges shall be increased by 50 per centum when overtime work is required to be performed on any Sunday or other day appointed by the Governor to be a day when Customs Houses are closed for business :

Provided that ships whose overtime work falls under more than one category shall for such period they are actually so working, pay the higher rate plus 50% of the lower category or, if two rates are similar, one rate plus 50% of the other. No ship shall be charged under more than one rate and 50% of another :

Provided also that where overtime work applied for is performed, the minimum charge shall be as for $\frac{1}{2}$ an hour, except on Sundays and public holidays, where charge as for 1 hour shall be the minimum.

If cancellation of an application for overtime is, in the opinion of the Collector, made in sufficient time before the attendance has been applied for to allow of staff being advised and attendance avoided, such cancellation shall be made without charge.

If overtime has been applied for and the aircraft or vessel does not arrive and the application for overtime attendance has not been cancelled in sufficient time to prevent attendance of the officers detailed, charge will be made as for a minimum of one hour and, if not cancelled upon the expiration of one hour from the hour of commencement of overtime work as applied for, until cancellation is made. The charge made shall be for the total number of hours of attendance up to the time of cancellation subject to any part not exceeding half an hour following the first hour being charged for as for half an hour.
