THE MAINTENANCE ORDERS (FACILITIES FOR ENFORCEMENT) LAW.

CAP. 22

PROCLAMATION UNDER SECTION 11.

A. B. WRIGHT,

Governor.

Whereas by section II of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Law it is provided that where the Governor is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any British possession or any territory under Her Majesty's protection for the enforcement within such possession or territory of maintenance orders made by Courts in Cyprus, the Governor may by Proclamation extend the said Law to such possession or territory:

And whereas I am satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of the Union of South Africa for the enforcement within the Union of South Africa of maintenance orders made by Courts in Cyprus:

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers vested in me by the said section II of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Law, and of every other power and authority enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor, do hereby order and proclaim that the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Law shall extend to the Union of South Africa as from the 13th day of November, 1953.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the Colony at Nicosia, this 17th day of December, 1953.
