REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 20.

A. B. WRIGHT,

Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 20 of the Aliens and Immigration Law, 1952, I, the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following regulations:—

1. These regulations may be cited as the Aliens and Immigration (Amendment) Regulations, 1953, and shall be read as one with the Aliens and Immigration Regulations, 1949 and 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations"), and the principal Regulations and these regulations may together be cited as the Aliens and Immigration Regulations, 1949 to 1953.

2. Regulation 21 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the

insertion therein of the following sub-paragraph:

"(4) Any person who contravenes any of the foregoing provisions of this Part of the Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months or to a fine not exceeding twenty-five pounds or to both such imprisonment and fine.".
