## THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT REGULATIONS, 1953.

Notice under Regulation 14 (b).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by regulation 14 (b) of the Agricultural Produce Export Regulations, 1953, I, the Acting Director of Agriculture, do hereby order that until further notification Onions graded as "Picklers" and intended for export to any country in Europe shall be classified as "Picklers No. 1" or "Picklers No. 2" as described herebelow. Their containers shall be marked accordingly in letters I" in height.

"Picklers No. 1" shall consist of onions of a size not exceeding 14 inches

or less than  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch in diameter.

"Picklers No. 2" shall consist of onions of a size not exceeding  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches or less than 1 inch in diameter.

## No. 122. THE AGRICULTURAL PRODUCE EXPORT REGULATIONS, 1953.

Notice under Regulation 14 (b).

In exercise of the powers vested in me by regulation 14 (b) of the Agricultural Produce Export Regulations, 1953, and further to Notification No. 338 of 11th July, 1953, I, the Acting Director of Agriculture, hereby direct that until further notice:-

Onions intended for export to ports other than in the Mediterranean, United Kingdom and elsewhere in Europe, Aden and Port Sudan, need not be separated into the three sizes, "Large", "Medium" and "Small" as stipulated in the Fourth Appendix, Part IV 2 (d) of the Agricultural Produce Export Regulations, 1953. The containers of such onions shall be marked with the words "MIXED SIZE" and "COMMERCIAL", in letters not less than 1½" in height. Onions so exported shall comply with the provisions of the regulations 2 (a), 2 (b) and 2 (c) of the Fourth Appendix, Part IV of the Agricultural Produce Export Regulations, 1953.

No. 123. THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF PANAYIA. In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 20 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Panayia hereby make the following bye-laws:-

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Gazette: Improvement) Panayia Bye-laws, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Suppl. No. 3: Villages (Administration and Improvement) Panayia Bye-laws, 1951 18.7.1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Byelaws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration

and Improvement) Panayia Bye-laws, 1951 and 1954.

2. Bye-law 179 of the principal Bye-laws is hereby amended by the deletion from items 19, 55 and 56 thereof of the fees 1p. and 2 paras, 2p. and 2 paras, and 2p. and 2 paras and by the substitution therefor of the fees  $2\frac{1}{2}p$ . and 5 paras, 10p. and 10 paras, and 10p. and 10 paras respectively.
