New order mode No. 169. THE SUPPLIES AND SERVICES (TRANSITIONAL POWERS) (CYPRUS) ORDER, 1946. ORDER MADE BY THE COMPHTENT AUTHORITY UNDER DEFENCE REGULATION 61. In exercise of the powers vested in me by virtue of my appointment by the Governor as Competent Authority for the purposes of Defence Regulation 61, as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946, (which continues in force in consequence of the Emergency Law (Miscellancous Provision) 0000, 195 Gazette : (Cyprus) Order, 1953), I hereby order as follows:----Supplement 1. This Order may be cited as the Supplies and Services (Opening 10.12.1953 Shops) Order, 1054 of Shops) Order, 1954. cre conicent 2. In this Orderad-pape 173. "shop" means any premises or place within the municipal limits of the towns of Nicosia, Larnaca, Limassol, Famagusta, Paphos and Kyrenia, and all the rural municipalities, where any foodstuffs are sold, whether by wholesale or by retail, or where any such foodstuffs are made or prepared for sale, and includes any municipal market. 3. From and after the 13th day of March, 1954, all shops shall, subject to the provisions of the Shop Assistants (afternoon Week-day) Closing Order, 1952, and the Shop Assistants (Closing Hours) Variation Order, 1952, Gazette: open and remain open from 8 o'clock in the forenoon to 6 o'clock in the Supplement No. 3 : 9.7.1952 afternoon on every day, except Sundays. 4. Any shop-keeper or any other person, whether having the control, management or charge of a shop or not, who acts in contravention of, or fails to comply with, any of the provisions of this Order, shall be liable to the penalties prescribed in the Defence Regulations as set out in the First Schedule to the Supplies and Services (Transitional Powers) (Cyprus) Order, 1946.
