THE PORT WORKERS (REGULATION OF EMPLOYMENT) LAW, 1952.

REGULATIONS MADE UNDER SECTION 5.

R. P. Armitage, Governor.

In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 5 of the Port Workers (Regulation of Employment) Law, 1952, I, the Governor, with the advice 35 of 1952 of the Executive Council, do hereby make the following Regulations:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Port Workers (Regulation of Schedule Employment) (Amendment) Regulations, 1954, and shall be read as one with to Law 35 the Port Workers (Regulation of Employment) Regulations, 1952 and the of 1952. Port Workers (Regulation of Employment) (Amendment) Regulations, 1953 (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the principal Regulations") and the 26.11.1953 principal Regulations and these Regulations may together be cited as the Port Workers (Regulation of Employment) Regulations, 1952 to 1954.

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2. Sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (2) of Regulation 5 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended by the insertion therein at the end thereof of the following further proviso (the full stop at the end of sub-paragraph (b) being substituted by a colon):—

"Provided further that no registered port worker shall be allocated to an employer for the purpose of acting as a signalman during cargo operation without the consent of such employer.".

- 3. Regulation 14 of the principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows:-
 - (a) the first paragraph shall be numbered as paragraph (1); (b) its second paragraph shall be numbered as paragraph (3);

(c) there shall be inserted between its first and second paragraphs

the following paragraph:-

"(2) Any trade dispute, whether existing or apprehended, shall be reported, by or on behalf of the Commissioner, to the Chairman of the Board established in respect of the port in which the dispute occurs or is apprehended.".
