THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

Bye-laws made by the Improvement Board of Mallia.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Mallia hereby make the following bye-laws:—

- 1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Mallia (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Mallia Bye-laws, 1952 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws"), and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Mallia Bye-laws, 1952 and 1954.
- 2. Bye-law 51 (1) of the principal Bye-laws as set out in the First Appendix thereto, is hereby deleted and the following bye-law substituted therefor:—
  - "Bye-law 51.—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any fresh meat in the meat market, that is to say:
    - s. p.
      (a) For every carcass of sheep or goat or part thereof . . . 1 3
    - (b) For every carcass of young lamb or kid of less than 6 okes in weight or part thereof ......

    - (d) For every carcass of ox, camel, cow or bullock or part thereof not exceeding 30 okes in weight but not exceeding 60 okes in weight ...

The above bye-laws have been approved by the Acting Colonial Secretary.
