THE FOREIGN DESERTERS LAW.

CAP. 272.

## NOTIFICATION UNDER SECTION 2.

In exercise of the powers vested in him under section 2 of the Foreign Deserters Law, His Excellency the Governor has been pleased to declare that the notification made under section 2 of the aforesaid Law and published under No. 7291 in the Gazette of the 26th August, 1904, shall, as from the 10th day of February, 1954, cease to have effect in respect of the Kingdom of Greece and that the aforesaid Law shall apply in the case of the Kingdom of Greece subject to the following limitations, conditions and qualifications, namely—

- (a) the said Law shall only apply as respects seamen and apprentices who described the ships registered at any port in the Kingdom of Greece, and when those ships are within the Colony; and
- (b) nothing in the said Law shall be taken to confer any power or impose any duty or obligation on any Court, judge, magistrate or officer in relation to the apprehension, or conveyance on board his ship, of a deserter who satisfies that Court, judge, magistrate or officer that he is:—
  - (i) a citizen of the United Kingdom and Colonies or a Southern Rhodesian citizen or a British protected person; or
  - (ii) a person in respect of whom there is reasonable ground for believing that his life or liberty will be endangered, for reasons of race, nationality, political opinion or religion, in any country to which his ship is likely to go.
