## BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF SINDA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Sinda hereby make the following bye-laws:—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Sinda (Amendment) Bye-laws, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Sinda Bye-laws, 1951 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Bye-laws") and the principal Bye-laws and these bye-laws may together be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Sinda Bye-laws, 1951 and 1954.

## THE VILLAGES (ADMINISTRATION AND IMPROVEMENT) LAWS, 1950 AND 1953.

## BYE-LAWS MADE BY THE IMPROVEMENT BOARD OF GALATIA.

In exercise of the powers vested in them by section 24 of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, the Improvement Board of Galatia hereby make the following bye-laws:—

1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Galatia Bye-laws, 1954.

2.—(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2), (3) and (4) of this bye-law, the Villages (Administration and Improvement) (Pedhoulas) Bye-laws, 1951, published in Supplement No. 3 to the *Gazette* of the 14th March, 1951 (hereinafter called "the model bye-laws") shall—

(a) be deemed to be bye-laws made by the Improvement Board of Galatia and to be incorporated herein, and

(b) apply to the improvement area of Galatia:

Provided that for the word "Pedhoulas" and for the word "Nicosia" wherever they occur in the model bye-laws, the word "Galatia" and the word "Famagusta" shall be substituted respectively.

(2) The bye-laws set out in the First Appendix hereto shall be substituted for the corresponding bye-laws of the model bye-laws.

(3) The bye-laws of the model bye-laws referred to in the Second Appendix hereto have been adopted by the Improvement Board of Galatia subject to the amendments specified in the said Appendix.

(4) The bye-laws of the model bye-laws mentioned in the Third Appendix hereto shall not apply to the improvement area of Galatia.

FIRST APPENDIX.

(Bye-law 2 (2).)

BYE-LAWS TO BE SUBSTITUTED.

*Bye-law 26.*—(1) The following fees shall be paid by the owner of or the person slaughtering any animal in the appropriate slaughter-house, that is to say :—

Provided that when any animal which has been slaughtered is to be used exclusively by the owner and his family for the purpose of salting, one shilling shall, irrespective of the weight of the animal, be paid in lieu of the fees hereinbefore prescribed.

*Bye-law 37.*—(1) The following fees shall be paid by every person exposing for sale any perishable goods in the market of perishable goods, that is to say :—

(a) When the value of such goods is under two shillings .. .. .	—	1

(c) When the value of such goods exceeds four shillings but does not exceed eight shillings .. .. .	—	3

(2) If the value of such goods exceeds £4, a fee of 4 piastres for each additional pound or fraction thereof shall be added to the aforementioned fee of 1 shilling.

Fees shall be calculated on the actual weight of the goods weighed at the above rates :

Provided that—

- (a) Fractions under 10 *paras* shall not be collected.
- (b) For fractions of 10 *paras* and over and under 30 *paras* the sum of 20 *paras* shall be collected.
- (c) For fractions of 30 *paras* and over and under 40 *paras* the sum of 40 *paras* shall be collected:

Provided also that the minimum fee for any one weighing or measuring or testing shall be 1*p*.

## No. 384. ✓ THE IRRIGATION DIVISIONS (VILLAGES) LAW. CAP. 111.

In pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Law, Cap. 111, the following rules made by the Committee of the Irrigation Division of Nikitari, in the District of Nicosia, are published in the *Gazette*.

### IRRIGATION DIVISION OF NIKITARI.

#### Rules.

1. These rules may be cited as the Irrigation Division of Nikitari Rules, 1954.
2. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—
  - “Commissioner” means the Commissioner of the District of Nicosia.
  - “Committee” means the Committee of the Irrigation Division.
  - “Irrigation Division” means the Irrigation Division of Nikitari.
  - “Law” means the Irrigation Divisions (Villages) Law, Cap. 111.
  - “List” means the list of the names and residence of the proprietors and of the lands and extent thereof which are to be benefited or are capable of being benefited by the works prepared under the provisions of section 15 of the Law as finally settled under the provisions of section 16 of the Law.
  - “Works” means the irrigation works of the Irrigation Division.
3. The Committee shall hold office for a period of three years beginning on the 11th April, 1954. Thereafter the election of the Committee shall take place every third year in the last week of the month of March and it shall hold office for a period of three years from the day next following its election.
- 4.—(1) The Committee shall appoint a treasurer who shall collect the rates and charges assessed upon the proprietors mentioned in the list.
  - (2) The treasurer shall, on the 1st October, in every year, prepare a statement of all rates or charges still due and unpaid on that date and shall forward such statement to the Commissioner.
  - (3) The treasurer shall receive a remuneration of three per centum of all rates and charges collected by him as in paragraph (1) hereof, and, in addition, he shall be paid such of his out of pocket expenses as may be sanctioned by the Committee.
5. Every proprietor mentioned in the list shall pay a rate not exceeding 60*s*. per annum as may be prescribed by the Committee from time to time for every Government donum of land owned by such proprietor which is benefited or is capable of being benefited by the works.
6. All rates assessed under the provisions of the Law and of these rules shall be paid on or before the 30th September, in every year.
7. The list shall be examined annually not later than the 1st day of May, in every year, by the Committee who shall have power to amend same as in section 16 (6) of the Law provided.
8. The annual estimates of the Irrigation Division shall be submitted by the Committee to the Commissioner for approval not later than the 1st day of December, in every year.
