In exercise of the powers vested in me by section 22 (a) (i) of the Villages (Administration and Improvement) Laws, 1950 and 1953, I, the Colonial Secretary, do hereby order as follows:—

- 1. The Improvement Board of Ayios Theodhoros (hereinafter referred to as "the Board") shall be at liberty to borrow from the Loan Commissioners (hereinafter referred to as "the Lenders") a sum not exceeding one thousand seven hundred pounds (£1,700) at a rate of interest not exceeding four per centum (4%) per annum, subject to the following terms and conditions, that is to say:—
 - (a) the sum borrowed shall be repayable by the Board to the Lenders in eight equal annual instalments (comprising sinking fund and interest);
 - (b) the sum borrowed shall be utilized by the Board for the purpose of improving the streets within the village.
